

FEDERAL GRANTS

1. The Federal Pell Grant is a federally-funded program designed to help undergraduate students pay for their education. Eligibility for the Federal Pell Grant is determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and satisfactory academic progress. The amount depends on the FAFSA's calculated eligibility, costs to attend school, and the number of credit hours enrolled per semester. 2. The Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) program provides assistance to eligible undergraduate students who enroll in at least 6 credit hours and show greatest financial need, are making satisfactory academic progress toward their educational goal and receive a Federal Pell Grant. A student can receive between \$500 and \$2,000 a year, depending on financial need, date of application, the amount of other aid received, and the availability of funds at COM.
